Fall 2024 Grant Allocations

Emergency Grants

Organization	The Grant
Mashiv Haruach Initiative Reg. #580501773	\$50,000 in support of help for the helpers through one -to two-day workshops for first responders. Chosen by the Israeli Trauma Coalition as their designated provider of resilience workshops – they are also an authorized WHO supplier in the field of resilience.
Tamar – mental health Arab society (Bedouin) Reg. #580607133	\$32,000 was allocated to Mental health resources for Arab society (the Negev and northern Israel). This includes a mental health hotline in Arabic, short-term in-person and online emotional support, guidance and training for care professionals, psychosocial material in Arabic, and a campaign to encourage the population to seek help.

Multiyear Grants

Organization	The Grant
Sikkuy-Aufog Reg. #580183580	This is the third and final payment of a three-year grant of \$90,000, which now supports the organization's updated grant goals, including advancing the effective implementation of the Ministry of Education's directive to advance education for a shared society, preventing detrimental legislation in the field of education, and pushing back against persecution, incitement, and racism towards Arab educators, staff, and students.
Rashut Harabim Reg. #055373363	The second and final payment of a two-year grant of \$30,000. Rashut Harabim leveraged this grant to appoint a professional coordinator to take responsibility for the Community House (a previously neglected bomb shelter that was renovated) to maximize its potential as a community hub promoting values of Jewish pluralism, facilitate activities and build community among diverse communities, organizations, and residents of Kiryat HaYovel, (e.g. workshops, text study, Shabbat and holiday services, family and children's activities, creating a curated outdoor leisure space, and more).

New Grants Fall 2024

Organization	The Grant
Women Wage Peace Reg. #580602308	\$30,000 - Women Wage Peace is the largest grassroots peace movement in Israel. Its purpose is to foster a peace process that ensures a voice for women and works collaboratively with Palestinian partners. Today, the movement has more than 50,000 members.
Shomrim - Center for Media and Democracy in Israel Ltd. (CC) Reg. #516112034	\$25,000 - Israel's only nonprofit, independent investigative news organization. Established four years ago, it is dedicated to strengthening Israeli democracy through investigative journalism that provides accurate, trustworthy information, holds power accountable, and drives change. They delve into topics often overlooked by mainstream media and bring the voices of those underrepresented to the decision-making table.

Tishreen Reg. #580498137	\$20,000 - Tishreen is a non-partisan civil society organization founded in 2008 in the Triangle area of Israel (included in the Triangle Communities are Kafr Qara, Ar'ara, Baqa al-Gharbiyye, Umm al Fahm, Qalansawe, Tayibe, Kafr Qasim, Tira, Kafr Bara, and Aquila) home to about 300,000 residents. They aim to strengthen civil society and empower young leadership (ages 15-25) to achieve greater social justice and equality. The organization addresses socio-economic and cultural marginalization through leadership training, community projects, and cultural programs. Some of the challenges they face include systemic discrimination, limited educational resources, and increasing community violence.
Citizens Build a Community - Lod Reg. #580433811	\$15,000 - The organization implements projects that promote social responsibility, engagement, and mobility through educational and vocational training, empowering the city's high-school seniors and post-high-school youth and ensuring their ability to give back to their community in the future. Their goal is to provide Lod's youth with meaningful opportunities to realize their potential and create future community leadership and support networks that contribute to building a cohesive and inclusive community.
Injaz Reg. #580500544	\$30,000 - The Injaz Center for Professional Arab Local Governance is successfully enhancing Arab local authorities' capacities to lead socio-economic development in Arab municipalities as well as to optimize their functioning, thereby improving the standard of living and quality of life of the municipalities' citizens.
Tag Meir - Yod Bet Heshvan Reg. #580463933	\$20,000 - Tag Meir seeks to transcend religious divides, enlisting support from across the Israeli spectrum, from secular through Reform and Conservative to Orthodox and Ultra-Orthodox. Tag Meir is the umbrella organization that runs a coalition of partnerships with a forum of 50 Israeli organizations and institutions.
Project Wadi Attir Reg. #580540896	\$20,000 - This is a groundbreaking initiative of The Sustainability Laboratory and a Bedouin community in the Negev Desert. It demonstrates an approach to sustainable dryland agriculture that leverages Bedouin's traditional values and experience with modern-day science and cutting-edge technologies.
The Shamsuna Center – Sayyid Alharumi Initiative Reg. #580761096	\$20,000 - Aims to harness the potential of solar energy to strengthen and empower the Bedouin community by improving access to energy. Wider and better access to energy will result in creating jobs, generating active and passive sources of income and strengthening Bedouin land rights in the Negev.
